H. Isolate the initial sound in one-syllable spoken words	Onset Fluency: Weeks 1-4, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 20, 22-24
I. Segment spoken one-syllable words into individual phonemes	; Segment words into Phonemes: Weeks 13-35
